A LIGHT SHINES IN THE DARKNESS: CHRISTIAN FORMATION AND HEALING AFTER A TRAGEDY

Notes by Sue Vogelman, Church School Director at Trinity Episcopal Church, Newtown, CT

Information based on the workshop presented at the Kanuga Christian Formation Conference June 2015 called: Hope in the Midst of Crisis. Here are my "notes" in very rough format for anyone who might find our experiences and responses helpful. Prayers to you and your community.

- When a community is affected by a disaster or tragedy, people flock to their houses of worship for comfort, solace, and healing.
- Hear what Trinity Episcopal Church in Newtown, CT used for Sunday School curriculum, worship, enrichment, support, and long-term ongoing healing after the tragic shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School.
- Learn how our "Helping is Healing" outreach and mission activities are working to restore light and love into our children's lives and the lives of others around the world.

About Sue Vogelman

- Lives in Newtown, CT. Has a husband and two sons one son just finished first year of college, the other just finished 7th grade.
- Grew up in Newtown. Attended University of Rochester, Rochester, NY. Received a BA in Psychology and a BA in Political Science.
- Returned to Newtown after university to attend a local graduate school for elementary education certification program.
- Placed for student teaching at Sandy Hook Elementary School (one of four elementary schools in Newtown).
- Was hired as a kindergarten and then first grade teacher at Sandy Hook School (SHS) for 11 years or from 1989 through June of 2000.
- Full-time Church School Director at Trinity Episcopal Church in Newtown, CT since fall of 2000 where I have worked with children and youth in my very busy parish for the last 15 years.
- Sue has been the piano accompanist for the Sandy Hook School 4th Grade Chorus rehearsals and concerts for last 6 years.
- Volunteered in the new location of Sandy Hook School immediately after the tragedy and continues to work/volunteer there part time.
- While at Trinity:
 - Served on the Diocese of Connecticut's Christian Formation Commission for several years planning diocesan formation events and engaging in diocesan and national conversations.
 - Member of <u>Forma</u>: a grassroots association of over 400 members of The Episcopal Church and kindred individuals and institutions, Forma *supports*, *networks*, *advocates for*, *resources*, and *celebrates* Christian formation leaders in their Christian formation ministries. Episcoforma.org
 - Was elected to the Forma Board Forma is in 2014 and is currently Secretary.

THE TRAGEDY OF 12/14/12 AT SANDY HOOK SCHOOL, NEWTOWN, CT

- On December 14, 2012 at 9:35 am, a 20-year-old male resident of Sandy Hook, entered SHS by force and killed 20 first graders and 6 adult educators including the principal, school psychologist, 2 teachers and 2 educational assistants. He also killed his mother and himself. 28 people in about 10 minutes.
- ❖ We in Newtown call it "12/14."
- Nothing in our lives has been the same since that time.
- Trinity Church lost Benjamin Wheeler 7, whose mother and older brother had been (and continue to be) active members for 3 years prior.



- ❖ And Charlotte Bacon 7, whose family (parents and older brother) had attended for 2 years prior, but recently left Trinity to worship at the Lutheran Church since her grandparents had just moved to town.
- Our preschool lost 6 alumni with 2 families currently enrolled losing an older child of their preschooler.
- **Everyone** knew child/sibling/family member/neighbor/coworker/etc. of those who were killed. Many of our families lived in the same neighborhood as the shooter and his mother.
- The entire town had PTSD especially the children/adults inside or close to Sandy Hook School.

DAY 1: TRINITY'S IMMEDIATE RESPONSES/ACTIONS

- Church was opened for prayer 24/7 with volunteers present at all times.
- Our three Bishops were there by mid-afternoon and fielded phone calls and media.
- Bishops comforted staff and people coming in since our rector was with the grieving families.
- Bishops and staff planned and prepped an evening service.
- ❖ I asked Forma list-serve for help. Received responses within seconds.
- "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping."

 Fred Rogers
- That same Friday night we held a community prayer service in the Taize style. Over 500 people attended (our sanctuary only holds about 350).
- ❖ All Newtown houses of worship held services all filled or overflowing.
- Someone donated cases of tissues; best donation for the immediate response.
- ❖ We prayed, we hugged, we cried, we sang, we mourned, we comforted as best we could.

DAY 2: TRINITY'S IMMEDIATE RESPONSES/ACTIONS

- ❖ Saturday morning 12/15, the official list of names came out in the media.
- ❖ We held a second vigil on Saturday night with our Bishops.
- ❖ I spent hours gathering resources to share with my volunteer Church School teachers and all our parents.
- So busy, so much media, and so many phone calls, interruptions, people coming in, etc. Overwhelming. Prepare now – don't wait until you are in need.

DAY 3: TRINITY'S IMMEDIATE RESPONSES/ACTIONS FOR SUNDAY MORNING:

- On Sunday, only 48 hours after the shooting, it was Advent III.
- We did what we do best; we met, we worshiped, and we had Church School. Keep the regular routine as much as possible for the children/youth.
- Brought in extra therapists, extra clergy, counselors, grief specialists, etc. Spread them around the building to help as needed.
- Gave the teachers/leaders a simple lesson plan to follow most of what we did is now in the ERD Lesson Plans called Ministering to Children/Youth After α Disaster and I highly recommend this: http://www.episcopalrelief.org/press-and-resources/resource-library



- ❖ During Children's Liturgy (which had over 35 kids at each service) I told the familiar and comforting story of the Angels proclaiming the Good News to the Shepherds in the field using the Godly Play script and props. You can use any familiar comforting bible story depending on the church season/lectionary or just pick one that works. - The light from the angels shone in the darkness and the angel said, "Do not be afraid." It was exactly what the children (and their parents) needed to hear.
- ❖ We followed our usual liturgy service and said special prayers for those we lost. One first grade child who had been in the school raised her hand and said, "My friends died." We prayed for her friends and a therapist sat with her while the kids scratched away at the angel scratch art papers I had on hand while we prayed.
- The Church School Classes were also packed, and the teachers were nervous about the questions they were going to receive from the kids. The ERD lesson plan style really helped.
- ❖ Do something with your hands. We provided each church school class with many colored paper hearts. They also followed the usual routine, teaching their Christmas Story lessons and letting the children write/draw/express their thoughts and prayers onto the paper hearts. We let the children/youth decide what to do with the prayer hearts. Give them to the affected families, hang them up, take them home, etc.

DAYS 4 THROUGH 7 – FUNERALS/MEMORIAL SERVICES – SOMETHING FOR THE CHILDREN

- ❖ At Benny's funeral held at Trinity on the Thursday following 12/14, there were about 60-70 children present including many of our own choristers, friends of the Wheeler family, and parishioners. Also hundreds of Boy Scouts were outside.
- ❖ I found inexpensive lighthouse ornaments to hand out to all the children present, and Pastor Kathie did a special children's sermon moment for the kids present on light. Here is a link to lighthouse keychains, but anything that relates to your message would work.
- Penas is the Light.
- We found out later that we probably were the only church to do something specifically for the children at any of the funerals.

LONG-TERM HEALING: WEEK 2 THROUGH 6 MONTHS:

- Every Sunday we had special prayers and allowed the kids to do art, free expression, creative type activities such as banner making, Praying with Color, doodling, clay, etc.
- They really found comfort in doing things with their hands while their minds and hearts were working.
- Adults met in the evenings with a psychiatrist who was also an Episcopal priest.
- Regular support group time seemed to help the older parishioners most. The ones who were grieving but didn't know with whom or how to share their feelings.


Reactions/Healing Often Associated with the Ripples

Huge variation in the amount, type, timing of grieving and healing.

- Students/Teachers/Others in the school and their families
- First responders including clergy
- Parents of students in the school
- People who know someone in the school
- People who had spent time in the school (former staff, former students, etc.)
- Everyone else nearby or far away (not inclusive and not a hierarchy)

People across "the ripples" found that helping others was healing.

95% of the residents in Newtown/Sandy Hook who took a survey said the Helping others was healing:



LONG TERM: HELPING IS HEALING

Almost immediately and continuing to this day, we started doing things for ourselves and other people who needed some light

- ❖ We had a <u>Painting Table</u> session thanks to Sharon Pearson and Roger Hutchinson and attended by 80 parishioners.
- We distributed items donated to us by caring groups/individuals: prayer shawls, lines of love bracelets, books, teddy bears, scarves, pillow cases, etc. to our kids and then shared the extra with other communities in need.

Ben's Lighthouse: Helping is Healing http://benslighthouse.org/

A group of Trinity parishioners solicited funds from a private donor and founded Ben's Lighthouse with the blessing of the Wheeler family.

- Volunteers organized free community events such as Lighthouse Festivals, Ice-cream socials, holiday events, 12/14 anniversary support, teen mentors, teen volunteer clubs, mission trips, educational seminars, etc.
- Over two and a half years, the mostly-volunteer organization (its first staff member was hired in September 2014) ...
- Held several joyful community events to remind children and families of the good within the town (4,000+ people attended)
- Launched weekend and after-school programs to promote resiliency skills for teens
- Friendship and mentoring clubs for those kids who needed it most
- Engaged in relief mission trips for high school youth to help them reclaim their inner light through service: #HelpingIsHealing



ANNIVERSARIES, HOLIDAYS, HEALING

- Simple prayers, lighting of candles, bell ringing, provide artistic outlets, comfort animals, lots of hugging.
- Keep the media away as much as possible.
- Stick to the comfortable and routine whenever possible.
- Just provide a place for people to gather and express themselves.
- Community is what gets us through it.
- Prayer, prayer and more prayer!

THINGS TO WATCH FOR AND BE AWARE OF IN YOUR COMMUNITY:

- Have persistent feelings of guilt
- ❖ Are reluctant to discuss how the tragedy has impacted them
- Have a lack awareness of services available in the community to assist
- Noticed a fracturing that has occurred among some individuals and groups
- Feel a 'hierarchy of impact' has led to a competition for grief and resources
- Are suffering in silence or guilt because they don't feel as if they should be struggling
- Feel like they don't have a right to reach out for help because they weren't as directly impacted as someone else
